DAY-BY-DAY

Upon arrival in Marrakech, please proceed through customs and immigration formalities. Collect your baggage and proceed outside where you are met by our representative then drive to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

Explore Marrakech's historic Medina, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and visit architectural gems like the Koutoubia minaret, Bahia Palace, and Dar el Bacha Museum. Experience the vibrant atmosphere of Djemaa el-Fna square and the bustling souks before returning to your hotel for dinner and an evening at leisure.

Travel from Marrakech to the High Atlas Mountains, passing through small villages and beautiful scenery. After reaching the Tizi n Tichka pass, the journey continues through the lunar landscape of the Anti-Atlas and passes by Skoura palm grove, Kelaa des Mgouna, and the Dades Gorges before arriving at the hotel for dinner and overnight stay.

Our journey continues to Tinghir, a stop for Berber tribes and home to a hidden 19th-century adobe mosque, before reaching the stunning Todra Gorge with its 300-meter-high walls and crystal clear river. We pass Erfoud and Rissani, with the option to visit Musée des Oasis, before reaching Merzouga where we embark on a 4WD Land Rover to explore the dunes of Erg Chebbi and spend the night in a Berber tent.

Enjoy a sunrise camel ride along the golden dunes in Merzouga. Return to your Riad for breakfast before transferring to Zagora via the Amazigh (Berber) villages of Alnif and Tazarine. The road to Tazzarine sees almost no traffic, providing a scenic link between Tafilalet and Draa Valley. Aside from the landscape, fossils and prehistoric rock carvings are this region's main attraction. The scenery grows wilder as you approach Tazzarine, set in a grassy oasis surrounded by bare mountains. Continue to Zagora. Famous for its palms valley which is the largest in Morocco. Dinner and overnight in your hotel.

06

After breakfast, enjoy the tour of Zagora including the oldest villages of Morocco. Stop by Tamegroute to visit the village's famous library, which houses ancient Koranic scripts dating back to the 12th century. Visit the pottery quarter of Tamgroute then transfer to Ouarzazate along the Draa valley.

Explore Ouarzazate, originally a French garrison known for its pottery and carpets. Visit the Taourirt Kasbah and continue to ksar Aït Ben Haddou, a UNESCO World Heritage site and home of exotic Kasbahs, featured in films such as Lawrence of Arabia and Gladiator, before journeying back over the High Atlas Mountains to Marrakech.

TRAVEL REQUIREMENTS

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Foreign visitors are required to have a valid passport and may need a visa depending on their nationality. It is recommended to check the entry requirements with the Moroccan embassy or consulate in their home country before traveling.

CURRENCY

The currency of Morocco is the Moroccan Dirham (MAD), which is divided into 100 centimes. It is best to exchange currency at official exchange offices or banks to avoid scams and counterfeit bills.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Morocco has a moderate level of healthcare and travelers are advised to purchase travel health insurance before their trip. In terms of safety, Morocco is generally considered safe for tourists, but visitors should take normal precautions such as being aware of their surroundings, avoiding displaying wealth, and taking care when using public transportation.

LANGUAGE

Moroccan Arabic is the most widely spoken language in Morocco, while French is also widely used in government, commerce, and education. Many Moroccans also speak Berber languages, particularly in rural areas.

CULTURE

Moroccan culture is a blend of Arab, Berber, and European influences, with a rich history that has left its mark on the country's traditions, art, and architecture. Hospitality is an integral part of Moroccan culture, and visitors can expect to be warmly welcomed and treated with generosity and respect.

TRAVEL TIPS

PACK SMART

It is recommended to pack comfortable and conservative clothing, including long-sleeved shirts and pants, as well as a scarf to cover your head in mosques and other religious sites. It's also important to bring sunscreen, a hat, comfortable walking shoes, and a refillable water bottle.

TRY THE LOCAL CUISINE

Moroccan cuisine is known for its bold flavors and fragrant spices, such as cumin, cinnamon, and saffron. Common dishes include couscous, tagine, pastilla, and harira soup, often made with meat (usually lamb or chicken), vegetables, and fruits like apricots and dates.
