THE BEST TIME TO VISIT

The best times to visit Jerusalem are April through May and October through November, when the weather is mild and the crowds are thin. However, make sure to cross-check your travel dates with major Jewish celebrations such as the High Holy Days, Sukkot, and Passover. A strong surge of visitor traffic drives hotel prices up during these holidays. Summer is Jerusalem's peak tourism season, despite sweltering daytime temps. Winters boast good deals on hotels, but the weather remains fickle: One day can be sunny and fairly warm, while the next can be rainy and chilly.

DAY-BY-DAY

After arrival at Ben Gurion Airport, you will be met by our transfer representative and transferred to your hotel in Tel-Aviv.

Start the day at the Israel Museum's Shrine of the Book to see the famous Dead Sea Scrolls, followed by a visit to the beautifully renovated Model of the Herodian city of Jerusalem. Then, visit Ein Karem, the birthplace of John the Baptist, Yad Vashem, the official memorial to the Jewish victims of the Holocaust, and Bethlehem to see the Church of the Nativity and Manger Square before returning to your Jerusalem hotel.

04 Itinerary

After breakfast, begin the day Leave Jerusalem and drive north passing by Jericho, the oldest city in the world.

Travel through the Jordan Valley and the new settlements to Beit Shean, and visit the excavations of this beautifully preserved Roman City.

On to Nazareth to visit the Church of the Annunciation and Christian holy sites.

Proceed to Safed, the city of the Kabbalah and the center of Jewish mysticism, to visit the beautiful streets of the artists colony.

After breakfast, drive up to the Golan Heights passing by Banias and former Syrian fortifications. Enjoy an Israeli wine country experience, proceed to Capernaum, and onwards to Tiberias, with the option to sail on a boat across the Sea of Galilee.

Drive to Acre to visit the Crusader stronghold and medieval fortifications, then continue to Haifa for a panoramic view of the city and Baha'i Shrine before visiting Caesarea to see the Roman Theater and the Crusader fortress, and finally end the day with a short city tour of Tel Aviv and the ancient port of Jaffa.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To enter Israel, visitors must have a valid passport, which should be valid for at least six months beyond the expected length of stay. Some visitors may also require a visa or entry permit, depending on their nationality and the purpose of their visit.

CURRENCY

The currency of Israel is the New Israeli Shekel (NIS). It is widely available in banks, ATMs, and currency exchange offices, and major credit cards are also widely accepted.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Israel has a high level of healthcare and medical facilities. It is generally a safe country to travel to, but visitors should be aware of the ongoing political tensions and potential security risks in certain areas.

LANGUAGE

The official languages of Israel are Hebrew and Arabic. English is widely spoken and understood, particularly in tourist areas and among younger generations.

CULTURE

Israel is a country with a diverse and rich culture, influenced by its history and the many different communities that make up its population. Jewish and Arabic cultures have had a significant impact on Israeli music, dance, cuisine, and traditions.

TRAVEL TIPS

PACK SMART

It is recommended to pack light, comfortable clothing suitable for the warm and sunny climate, as well as a hat and sunscreen. Modest clothing is required for visiting religious sites. A good pair of walking shoes and a light jacket for cooler evenings are also recommended.

Israeli cuisine is a diverse fusion of Jewish, Middle Eastern, and Mediterranean flavors. Some of the popular dishes include hummus, falafel, shakshuka, sabich, and schnitzel, among others.
