## TRAVEL REQUIREMENTS

### ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To enter Brazil, most visitors must have a valid passport and a visa, which can be obtained from a Brazilian consulate or embassy. However, visitors from certain countries are exempt from the visa requirement and can stay for up to 90 days. Additionally, all visitors must have proof of a return ticket or onward travel, and may need to show proof of sufficient funds for their stay.

### CURRENCY

The official currency of Brazil is the Brazilian Real (BRL), which is divided into 100 centavos. As of April 2023, the exchange rate is approximately 5.5 BRL to 1 USD. It is advisable to exchange currency at banks or authorized exchange offices to avoid counterfeit bills.

### HEALTH AND SAFETY

Brazil has some health concerns, such as the prevalence of mosquito-borne illnesses like dengue fever and Zika virus. Travelers are advised to take preventative measures and consult with a healthcare professional prior to their trip. As for safety, Brazil has a high crime rate, especially in urban areas. Visitors are encouraged to be vigilant, avoid carrying valuables, and only use official taxis or ride-sharing services.

### LANGUAGE

The official language of Brazil is Portuguese, which is spoken by the vast majority of the population. However, there are also many regional dialects and indigenous languages spoken throughout the country. It can be helpful for travelers to have some basic knowledge of Portuguese, especially when visiting

### CULTURE
