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# **GREECE**

Greece is a country in southeastern Europe with thousands of islands throughout the Aegean and Ionian seas. Influential in ancient times, it's often called the cradle of Western civilization. Athens, its capital, retains landmarks including the 5th-century B.C. Acropolis citadel with the Parthenon temple. Greece is also known for its beaches, from the black sands of Santorini to the party resorts of Mykonos.

## **THE BEST TIME TO VISIT**

Generally, the best weather in Greece is what you'll experience in May, June and September. Plenty of sunny days that aren't too hot make May an ideal time for long, leisurely walks in Athens. By June, the beaches of the Aegean islands are warm enough for swimming and popular islands like Mykonos aren't crowded yet.

Depart for Nafplion (short-stop), continue to Mycenae. Visit the Citadel and the Tomb of Agamemnon and depart for Olympia, across the Peloponnese. Arrive for dinner at your hotel.

## DAY-BY-DAY

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### 05

Begin your morning with breakfast at your hotel. Breakfast at hotel. Visit Olympia, the birthplace of the Olympic Games (Museum – Archaeological Site). Departure for Delphi, crossing the plains of Ilia and Achaia and reaching the large bridge of Rio, which connects the Peloponnese with mainland Greece (Antirio) through Lepanto and other picturesque towns. Dinner at your hotel.

## TRAVEL REQUIREMENTS

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### ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

As of September 2021, tourists traveling to Greece are required to complete a Passenger Locator Form and provide proof of vaccination, recovery from COVID-19, or a negative PCR test result. Visitors from certain countries may also be subject to additional testing upon arrival.

### CURRENCY

The currency of Greece is the Euro, which is the same currency used in several other European countries. Visitors can easily exchange their currency for Euros at banks, exchange offices, or ATMs throughout the country.

### HEALTH AND SAFETY

Greece is generally considered a safe destination for travelers, but visitors should take precautions to protect themselves against petty crime, such as pickpocketing, especially in crowded tourist areas. As for health, there are no specific vaccinations required for entry to Greece, but travelers should take basic health precautions such as washing their hands regularly and drinking bottled water.

### LANGUAGE

Greek is the official language of Greece, and it belongs to the Hellenic branch of the Indo-European language family. English is also widely spoken in major tourist areas.

### CULTURE

Greek culture is known for its rich history and influence on Western civilization, including philosophy, art, literature, and politics.
